



"Last Chance U" Gives Another Opportunity for Skilled Nursing Facility, Assisted Living, and Independent Living Staff and Essential Caregivers to Receive COVID-19 Vaccine

Community Pharmacy and the Nebraska Health Care Association are partnering to host COVID-19 vaccination clinics in Omaha, Lincoln, and Kearney on Feb. 13, and March 6, 2021. "Last Chance U" is for staff of Nebraska skilled nursing facilities, assisted living communities, and independent living communities, as well as Essential Caregivers (as defined by [Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services Essential Caregiver Guidance for Long-Term Care Facilities](#)), who have not received their first COVID-19 vaccine.

Registration closes at midnight on Tuesday, Feb. 9. Time slots are first come, first serve, and you will choose your time at registration. Registrants will receive their first dose on Feb. 13 and the required second dose during the same time slot on March 6. Vaccine cards will be distributed at the first clinic and participants will need bring them to the second clinic on March 6.

Staff of skilled nursing facilities, assisted living communities, and independent living communities must bring two forms of identification. These may include a facility name badge or facility pay stub, and a valid government-issued identification card. Essential Caregivers must bring the documentation from the facility that they completed during their Essential Caregiver training and a valid government-issued identification card. Both facility staff and Essential Caregivers must bring an insurance card if they are insured.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Which vaccine will be administered at the Last Chance U clinic?

Community Pharmacy will be administering the Pfizer-BioNtech COVID-19 Vaccine

When I go to register, it is asking for a password.

Yes, it does require a password. Please use: Project_Hug!

When I register, it is asking for a name of a facility, do I have to put a name in?

Yes, this clinic is only open to skilled nursing facilities, assisted living communities, independent living communities, and Essential Caregivers.

I don't have insurance. Can I still get vaccinated?

Yes, you do not need insurance to get vaccinated. However, if you do have insurance, we will require a copy of your insurance card. Please bring this with you.

Do I need to register again for the March 6 clinic?

No, you will only need to register once. The time you choose will be the time for both clinics.

I received my first dose at the Omaha clinic. Can I receive my second dose at the March 6 clinic in Kearney?

No, we are not able to have people move vaccination locations. You will need to receive your second dose at the original time and location of your first dose.

I received my first dose elsewhere (such as a previous employer or health department). Can I receive a second dose at Last Chance U?

No, we are not able to administer single doses such as this.

Is this clinic open to the public?

No, this clinic is only approved for staff of Nebraska skilled nursing facilities, assisted living communities, and independent living communities, as well as Essential Caregivers (as defined by [Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services Essential Caregiver Guidance for Long-Term Care Facilities](#)), who have not received their first COVID-19 vaccine.

Can I register after February 9?

No, registration closes at midnight on February 9.

Can I receive the Pfizer COVID-19 vaccine if I had a positive COVID-19 case in the last 90 days?

Yes, you can receive the vaccine *if* you are out of quarantine or you are 10 days past your positive test date or first onset of symptoms.

I received a different vaccine (e.g., flu, hepatitis, shingles) in the last 14 days. Can I still receive the COVID-19 vaccine at Last Chance U?

No, per CDC guidelines, you need to wait 14 days before getting the COVID-19 vaccine if you received any other vaccine in the last 14 days.

I just received a tuberculin (TB) skin test when starting my new job. Can I still get the COVID-19 vaccine?

Yes, the TB skin test has no effect on your ability to receive the vaccination. However, it is recommended that if you are needing a TB skin test in the future, you wait until four weeks after your COVID-19 vaccine.

When will I receive my vaccination card?

You will receive a card after your first dose and will need to bring that card with you to the second clinic on March 6.
